Hearing aid purchases include:

- 3 follow-up visits within the first year of initial fitting date with the original provider
- 60-day trial period from date of fitting
- 60 batteries per year per hearing aid (3-year supply. Non-rechargeable hearing aids only)
- 3-year manufacturer repair warranty
- 1-time replacement coverage for lost, stolen or damaged hearing aid (deductible may apply per aid)
- First set of ear molds (when needed)
